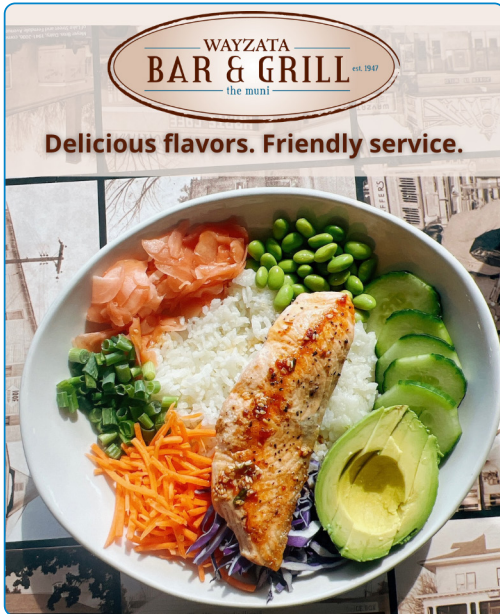
Celebrating New Wayzata Police Department Members

Enroll or Update Your Smart911 Profile

Sign up and create a Smart 911 profile to keep first responders in the loop on key information like allergies, medical history, pets, emergency contacts and more! This information is only accessible temporarily and only if you call 911. Your profile will preload and will automatically provide this information to first responders so you don't have to during a chaotic situation.

Keep it up to date! Remember to check your profile annually to make sure information provided in an emergency is as accurate as possible.

Property Valuation Notices Mailed Next Month

In March, Wayzata property owners will receive a Hennepin County 2026 Notice of Valuation and Classification indicating property values that will be used as a basis for taxes due in 2027.

Discuss this information with the City Assessor

If you believe the estimated market value or classification of your property is incorrect, contact the City's Assessor, Hennepin County, immediately after receiving your notice at 612-348-3046. They may be able to answer your questions without requiring your presence at the Board of Appeal and Equalization Meeting.

Attend Board of Appeal and Equalization Meeting

If you disagree with the Assessor's findings after they have reviewed your value and classification and you have information to support an appeal, attend the Board of Appeal and Equalization meeting on Thursday, April 7 at 5:30 p.m. at Wayzata City Hall. The property owner is responsible for presenting evidence about why the market value is not fair and equitable. By law, only objections to the market value or classification of your property for the 2026 values for taxes payable in 2027 will be addressed. The Board will not discuss your current property taxes.
